The idea for the day began in 1952 with Mary Barrett, president of the National Secretaries Association, now called IAAP (International Association of Administrative Professionals), and C. In 1955, the observance date of National Secretaries Week was moved to the last full week of April. The name was changed to Professional Secretaries Week in 1981, and became Administrative Professionals Week in 2000 to encompass the expanding responsibilities and wide-ranging job titles of administrative support staff.

The IAAP created National Secretaries Week (now Administrative Professionals Week) with two objectives in mind: to recognize "the secretary, upon whose skills, loyalty, and efficiency the functions of business and government offices depend," and to call attention "through favorable publicity, to the tremendous potential of the secretarial career." Today, it is one of the largest workplace observances and is celebrated worldwide through community events, social gatherings, and individual corporate activities.
