... One area where I get repeated questions involves the right of parents to access the mental health records of their minor children. State law varies greatly and in fine nuance as to a parent's right to access the records and information of their minor child. Some states require or permit the therapist to deny access to the records if the therapist determines that it would endanger the minor physically or psychologically. California, in recognition of the importance of confidentiality, requires the therapist, among other things, to deny access when the therapist determines that access to the minor's records would have a detrimental effect on the therapist's professional relationship with the minor (a very broad standard that protects confidentiality).
