The Hazards of Addiction Treatment in the Mental Health Care Field

Emotional Hardship

Patient Pain Pills

Recently, Buprenorphine has been discovered as a threat to mental health treatment. Medication or drug? Unfortunately, this drug itself has been subject to abuse by patients, and the prescribing physician is too-often to blame.

Patient Brokering

Some groups in the substance abuse and mental health field still operate on a referral payment program. In Florida and many other states, offering referral incentives is illegal and can get your practice in a lot of trouble!
